As many of you know the Time Exchange relies on grant funding to cover our running costs.

Funding for small charities like the Time Exchange is getting much harder.

We have not been successful with recent funding applications and if we do not raise much needed funds WE WILL HAVE TO CLOSE.

We need £3000 per month to keep the Time Exchange open to the public.

We are waiting to hear back about a number of other funding applications so the next few months are critical.

Something I heard this week both distressed me and left me feeling my future may be rather empty! Over the years, 'The Exchange' has provided me with endless emotional, personal and practical support and the news that it could close its doors made my blood boil too.

At present, unless we find further mainline funding, that is the case! In my belief, The Time Exchange has proved and continues to prove to be the most welcoming door, in a very needy community. In the past year alone, our 161 members have found their way to 3317 hours of support to each other. That same support took the form of everything from car lifts to cooking, home repairs and home tidying, sewing and shopping as well as endless emotional support to name a few. As a member, as long as it's legal, our members seem to stop at nothing!

Our staff provided 563 hours of 'one to one' support, ever proving that they both care and are very much in demand. They've even shared their office space over the year with members' wanting to run their own pet projects.

As a project, we regularly fulfil many of the environmental needs locally, attending to the street planters in season and helping out in The Bike Garden, as well as tidying the streets we live in. We've run various 'pet' projects over the years, including 'Food for All,' 'Community Cafe Nights' and 'Skills Café', ever responding to the needs of the community.

We need just over £3,000 a month to carry on as we do, so surely there's someone, somewhere, who considers us a worthwhile outfit!
